ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The *Basic Textiles Seminar* at Philadelphia University provides an introduction to textile products from raw material through finished fabrics. Problems in the manufacture of apparel and other consumer products will be discussed. Emphasis will be given to the basic language, process flow and performance characteristics of textile materials. In addition to classroom instruction, participants will have the opportunity to tour the laboratories and make use of the University's equipment.



WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Basic Textiles is recommended for management personnel and trainees employed in textile- and apparel-related fields, who wish to broaden their understanding of the entire industry. It is particularly useful to those who have entered the industry with little or no background in textiles.

INSTRUCTORS FOR BASIC TEXTILES

Basic Textiles is taught by members of the faculty of the School of Design and Engineering at Philadelphia University. In addition to their teaching responsibilities, the faculty provide industry technical assistance and serve as lab coordinators for the University's research programs.
