In this 20-hour, interactive, online course, midwives and women's health professionals will explore the application of current literature and research to clinical midwifery practice with a group of peers. The course offers 16 hours of continuing education specific to pharmacology. Using a round-table model, students are guided through current research on oxytocin, weight management therapies, and opiate addiction in pregnancy. Critical assessment of the literature and its' application to clinical midwifery practice is the focus of the discussion, along with exploration of medical, complementary and alternative (CAM) therapies. Assessment of learning is validated through topic-related quizzes and course participation. Designed for the busy clinician, this course allows participants to learn at their own pace within a three-week time frame while interacting on-line with colleagues. An estimated 10 hours a week should be allocated in order to be successful. The course is asynchronous, meaning that students can log in when convenient versus the same time every day.
