A fresh START...

Student

The essence of Philadelphia University lies with its community of students. START is a time for meeting future lab partners, teammates, club leaders, hallmates and lifelong friends.

Transition

START is designed to make the transition from high school to college as seamless as possible. Incoming students get to know our returning students, staff and faculty, participate in our programs, and learn about our services for the first time. By the end of their second day, participants make connections and become better acquainted with many aspects of their new environment-- everything from the residence halls and dining services to student groups, classes and the City of Philadelphia.

Advising

New Students will meet with faculty academic advisors and have an opportunity to ask questions about their first year course work and academic expectations. Academic advisors are members of the teaching faculty representing each of the University's areas of study.

Registration

Following their advising session, new students will receive class schedules for the fall semester.

Testing

First-year students will participate in a writing placement test that will assist in placing them in appropriate College Studies courses.

Arriving in the Fall

Incoming students will receive information about arrival in August through a later mailing. On August 20, 2009 residential students move in. Commuting students should arrive by 3:00p.m. on August 20.

All new students officially begin their Philadelphia University experience at Convocation, 4 p.m. on August 20, 2009. This is a ceremony rich in academic tradition to welcome students and family members into our University community. Following Convocation and a family picnic, we begin New Student Orientation (NSO) -- a required four-day program to introduce students to the academic culture, community standards and campus life of Philadelphia University. Fall semester classes begin on Monday, August 25.
