Summary of Information Literacy (ILTF) Activities 2007-2008

This was a year of realignment and re-establishment of the IL Program as a recognized, university-wide endeavor, involving each school on campus. The Program has been in a holding pattern as the administrative changes on campus were implemented by various departments. External to the Library, new School Deans, new faculty and staff members, a new President of the university, new programmatic and individual course offerings helped to shape a challenging year for the IL Program.

Overall, much was learned about what changes should be implemented in the upcoming year.

- Creation of online tutorials that can be utilized for multiple audiences, for example: Incoming students, First Year students, and CPS students. Tutorials for narrower audiences will be created in future years.
- Re-visiting of the targeted SBA IL courses, selecting new ones and dropping others from the program
- Increased support for graduate students
- Increased support for CPS students and faculty
- Creation of a uniform instructional support presence for all graduate Health Sciences programs. Face to face instruction and web-based support have been provided to each program on an individual basis. The programs have many similar support needs.
- Creation of SLA faculty development programming to use as a model for other schools
- Participation in Academic Affairs-sponsored faculty development programming

Some improvements were made to the design and delivery of instruction in some of the targeted courses, and discussions ensued about future instructional changes. Re-evaluation of the continued targeting of other courses was conducted, and alternative courses to target in the future were discussed.

The Library underwent internal changes of its own this year, involving leadership and staffing, which produced a separate and additional set of repercussions with relation to the IL Program. Despite these challenges, there were some important 2007-2008 achievements relating to outreach and instruction, which are outlined below.

Achievements

• Motion by UEC to include IL as part of its official charge

This administrative achievement was accomplished via the combined efforts of Kathy Mulroy, Director of the Library, and Dr. John Eliason, Director of Writing Across the Curriculum. The motion was presented by the UEC to the full faculty for a vote and was passed in Fall, 2007.

- o The IL Task Force is now the IL Subcommittee of the UEC, and is thus an official part of the university's governance structure again.
- o The IL Coordinator has been added to the UEC as an advisory member
- o A draft of text pertaining to the new IL Subcommittee was submitted by the IL Coordinator, for inclusion in the UEC Manual.

• Further Integration into School of Continuing and Professional Studies

Progress in the School of CPS included a combination of instructional and marketing achievements, with increased face to face sessions for CPS students and faculty support materials provided via E-Res. The IL Coordinator was invited to participate in the June 23 CPS meeting to revisit core CPS courses, and be part of the team of CPS faculty and university support staff who will work to improve these courses. This project will extend into the Fall 2008-2009 academic year.

• Outreach to Graduate Students

Supported by the Graduate Dean, the librarians were invited to a Jan 29, 2008 Graduate Student Thesis Workshop. As a result, a few E&T graduate students sought out the assistance of Barbara Lowry and Jordana Shane, to help them with their thesis research, and to set up Refworks accounts.

• Outreach to Undergraduate Instructors: Writing & Communication Seminar II

Marketing and faculty development achievement, sponsored by the Coordinator of
Writing and Communication Seminar II with support from the WAC Director. Results:
invitations to address several sections of Writing Seminar II, and increased collaborative
exchange with instructors.

• Outreach to New Employees: Stan Gorski's Campus Tours

Marketing and instructional achievement, supported by the Human Resources Department. Stan Gorski now offers tours of the campus and campus history to new hires several times a year. In addition to learning about the campus and school history, new hires on these tours have the opportunity to meet and learn about one another. The tours create an opportunity for new employees to feel more comfortable and integrated into the campus community.

• Outreach to Mifflin School Students: Literacy Day Celebration Nov 1, 2007

Marketing and instructional achievement, in collaboration with the Writing Across the Curriculum Program, the Honors Program, Nathaniel Popkin—University Writer in Residence 2007/2008. Library staff named in the summary table below all physically participated in the programming for the day, and also used supporting materials supplied and created by K. Mulroy. S Gorski supplied a historical artifacts display and an informational talk to all students present, as part of the tours. During the tours, several students of all ages expressed interest in how to get accepted into college, how to finance college, and what campus life is like at Philadelphia University. It was also related that the Library tours were the favorite part of the day for many students.

- Assessment: keep adding skill-building classes, but begin to formalize skill-expression classes (capstones and final projects).
- Creation of Incoming Student Survey using CoursEval, administered by Barbara Thomas
- Creation of Online Tutorials, with assistance from Mark Clauburg, IDS

- Formalize IL Learning Outcomes for ARCH591 Thesis Prep: Architecture Consider adding ARCH591 as a formally targeted IL course in the Architecture Curriculum, although not all students are required to enroll. Use theses as a sample for IL assessment purposes.
- Continue to provide support and instruction for currently targeted courses

- Target different classes: MKTG101 Principles of Marketing and MGMT301 Principles of Management have been suggested as courses to target for IL outcomes: these courses have historically requested instruction and support, discuss this with course instructors
- Revisit INFO101 exercise: students are of varying levels of ability and interest—perhaps part or all of the content of the exercise should be converted to an online tutorial format
- Remain apprised of progress towards AACSB accreditation: work to make information literacy part of any program changes that may occur as a result of seeking this accreditation

School of Design & Media

New Developments:

- New faculty representative: Beth Emmott served as Interim ILTF representative
- *IL Consultations:* Michael Krasulski had at least 15 conversations with Dennis Kuronen (Fall 07 and Spring 08) and Goetz Unger (Fall 07) about IL in Graphic and Industrial Design programs
- Graphic Design struggles in determining First Year targeted course. Dennis Kuronen suggests History of Western Art (E&T School) for first year course. Graphic students will no longer be enrolled in INFO 101 (SBA) as a core course for their program.

Goetz Unger wrote Information Literacy outcomes into the lesson plans of four pre-existing Industrial Design courses, all of which were taught by Josh Owen. Assessment and follow up of these classes will ensue in the coming year.

Dennis Kuronen recommended that GRAPH201 and GRAPH202 (Design III and Design IV for Graphic Design Communication students) should be the targeted courses for Graphic Design Communication, Second Year. Dennis, Michael Krasulski and Russ Pritchard discussed learning outcomes in these courses, and how IL fits into them. Several IL outcomes already exist as part of established learning outcomes for these courses, and were identified as such. The wording of the assignments' learning outcomes was modified accordingly to more clearly reflect the reality that IL outcomes are already including and being addressed by the course material and objectives.

Goetz and Dennis agreed to allow librarian-led instruction to address the IL Outcomes that are not covered by the D&M instructors themselves in the targeted assignments and courses. Result: faculty-delivered instruction with Requested instructional support from librarian when needed.

- Assessment of the targeted Industrial Design courses, and re-visiting of IL outcomes
- Extract existing IL Outcomes from targeted Graphic Design Communication courses, and devise assessment instruments for them
- Continued conversation and follow-up with the D&M Program directors to improve the IL experience for faculty and students
