- April Herring, director of Residence Life, recently conducted a workshop on accountability at the 10th annual Regional Entry-Level Institute (RELI) for Housing and Residence Life Professionals at Westfield State College in Westfield, Mass., June 12 through 14. She was one of only six professionals selected from the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic region to train 28 entry-level housing and residence-life personnel. RELI provides professional development opportunities for entry-level professionals who aspire to mid-level positions in residence life and beyond.
- Visiting Assistant Professor of History R. Scott Hanson, who is completing a book manuscript for Oxford University Press entitled *City of Gods: Religious Freedom, Immigration, and Pluralism in Flushing, Queens – New York City 1945-2001*, presented the keynote lecture May 30 at LaGuardia Community College-CUNY in Long Island City for an event celebrating the achievements of its Difficult Dialogues Project. Funded by the Ford Foundation, the yearlong project was developed to engage college and community members in a dialogue on religious issues. After five years of teaching in the School of Liberal Arts, Prof. Hanson will leave Philadelphia University at the end of August to pursue a position as Lecturer in the Intellectual Heritage Program at Temple University.
