4th Annual Gallagher Cup Challenge "One for the Ages"

Antheil's Answer posts fourth consecutive victory.



On April 13, Student Life staff (Antheil's Answer) took on the faculty team (Fixman's Force) to see who would be crowned champs and claim bragging rights for a year! In the end, it was the Answer's pressure defense which proved too much, as they took a fourth straight decision in the annual series, 61-51. The Force came out strong in the opening quarter, led early by Joel "Mad Hops" Scott, whose three pointer helped give the Force an early lead. Scott, finished with eight first-half points and was helped by Steven "Top Shelf" Bell, who registered nine points, bringing them to a 28-22 lead at the half. In the second half, however, The Answer outscored The Force 16-9 in the third quarter. The Answer was led by MVP Award Winner Brad "Malibu Ken" Koch, who scored nine points in the third frame as

Coach Tom "The PW Pistol" Shirley's decision to play a trapping man-to-man defense proved to be the key. In the fourth quarter, the Answer opened up a 13-point lead and eventual took the ten-point victory. Koch finished the contest with a game-high 22 points while Jackie "Lady Ram Legend" deMarteleire added 12 points in her Gallagher Cup debut. The Force was paced by Scott's 17 points, including three three-point field goals, while Bell and John "The Cyclonic" Eliason added nine points apiece.
