Judith Ann McKee, Ed.D., to be Interim Vice President of Academic Affairs and Dean of the Faculty

Judith Ann McKee, Ed.D., will serve as the interim vice president of Academic Affairs and dean of the Faculty while a search is conducted to appoint a successor to Dr. Carol Fixman. Dr. Fixman will join the Philadelphia Education Fund as its Executive Director on October 1.

Dr. McKee has more than 25 years of progressive experience in higher education and been a dedicated member of the University's administration since 1984. Currently, she serves as associate vice president for Academic Affairs and dean of Graduate Studies.

Her expertise in education in both public and private environments includes program development and evaluation, faculty development, outcomes assessment, faculty recruitment and evaluation, budget development and administration, marketing and student recruitment, student development, academic support services and policy development and implementation.

Dr. McKee received an Ed.D. from Temple University, and an M.Ed. and B.A. from the University of Delaware.

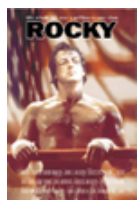
