

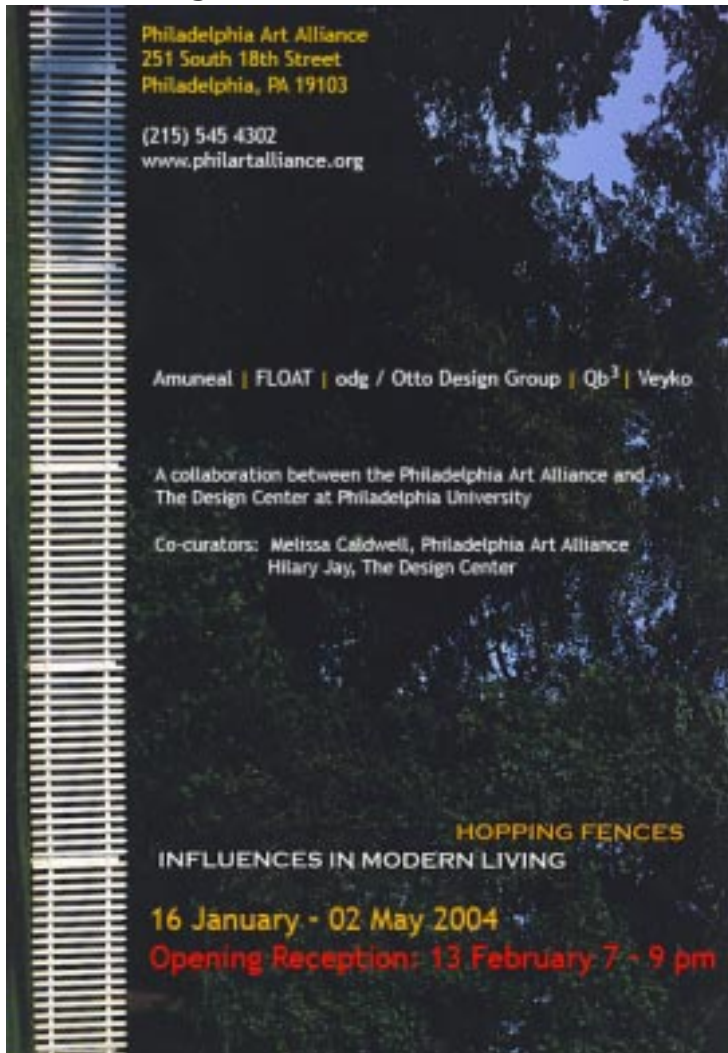

E-ZBorrow: Fast Access to More Books

The Paul J. Gutman Library is offering a new service that will allow all members of the Philadelphia University community to easily borrow books from a group of mostly Pennsylvania college and university libraries, including Penn, Pitt, Rutgers, Drexel, Temple and many others. E-ZBorrow is a “do-it-yourself” version of interlibrary loan. Students and faculty can search a database of over 35 million books, and place loan requests directly to another library - with no form to fill out.

All you need is a Library barcode, which is available from the Circulation Desk. Users receive emails when the book has been ordered and when it is available (this usually takes three to five business days) at Gutman Library. With so many books and libraries to choose from, a searchable catalog, and fast delivery, E-ZBorrow will greatly reduce the need to visit other academic libraries – AND – you can borrow from other libraries when our copies are already on loan or can’t be located.
