Philadelphia University Inducts Five into Athletic Hall of Fame

Five new inductees were welcomed to the Philadelphia University Athletic Hall of Fame at the annual Hall of Fame banquet on October 8, at the Adams Mark Hotel in Philadelphia.

Gallagher, who is celebrating his 20th year as the University's president, has been very instrumental in the success of one of the top NCAA Division II athletic programs in the nation. Conference to the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference this past spring.

File is in his third year as a relief pitcher with the Toronto Blue Jays. As a member of Head Coach Don Flynn's team at then-Philadelphia Textile, File set nearly every single-season school record in 1998, including homeruns with 19, en route to being named ABCA/Rawlings first-team All-America.

A member of one of Head Coach Herb Magee's most successful men's basketball teams, Fields is the third all-time leading scorer in school history with 1,956 points. An All-America selection in 1994, Fields helped the Rams to a four-year record of 112-12 including a perfect 66-0 record at home from 1991 to 1995.

Hildebrand is the fifth women's basketball player inducted into the Hall of Fame. A first-team All-America selection for Head Coach Tom Shirley in 1992, Hildebrand stands as the program's fourth all-time leading scorer with 1,695 points while also ranking fifth all-time with 206 steals and seventh all-time with 362 assists. Formerly the head women's basketball coach at Cabrini College, Hildebrand also made her mark on the softball diamond as well where her 45 hits in 1995 is the second-best single-season total in school history.

A legendary coach at the University for several years, Delaney has established himself as one of the top NCAA Division II men's basketball coaches at West Chester University with 306 career victories. An assistant under Herb Magee from 1975 to 1987, Delaney also served as the head baseball coach of the Rams for ten seasons, leading the program to its first-ever NCAA Tournament berth in 1987. During his tenure, Delaney was also the head men's tennis coach and an assistant coach for men's soccer, including the team's NCAA Division I Final Four team in 1978.

With the induction of the Class of 2004, the Philadelphia University Athletic Hall of Fame is now comprised of 47 individuals representing eight athletic programs as well as University administration. Save the date: next year's Athletics Hall of Fame Banquet is scheduled for October 7, 2005.

Philadelphia University Announces the Addition of Cross-Country Programs

Men's and Women's teams comprise 13th and 14th varsity athletic programs at the university.

Philadelphia University Director of Athletics Tom Shirley announced the addition of men's and women's cross-country to its varsity athletic programs. The teams will begin competition in the fall of 2005, coinciding with the University's move to the Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC) for the 2004-05 varsity athletic season.

"This is an opportunity for us to further enhance our intercollegiate athletic program," said Shirley of the impending move, which will bring the University's total number of varsity sports offered to 14. "With our move to the new conference, we are looking forward to building upon the local rivalries, including Holy Family University and the University of the Sciences, that have been formed and this is yet another forum for us to compete within the league. Attempting to create a program can be a daunting task, but we are confident that with the resources we have been afforded at Philadelphia University, we can be very successful."

Currently, Shirley is in the process of putting together a coaching staff for the teams, which will likely use Fairmount Park, in particular Belmont Plateau, as
