*Overseas Holiday delivery dates set.*

It's already time to start planning for overseas holiday mailings. Major dates for international delivery by December 25 are as follows. Mailings for delivery by Hanukkah should be sent five days earlier.

**November 13**-Parcel Post to military APO/FPO addresses

**December 6**-First class or priority mail to military APO AE zips 093 addresses

**December 6**-Global air mail and parcel post to Africa, Central or South America

**December 11**-First class or priority mail to all other military addresses

**December 13**-Global air mail and parcel post to other international addresses

**December 20**-Global express guaranteed international mail

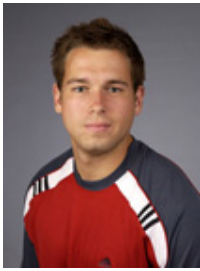

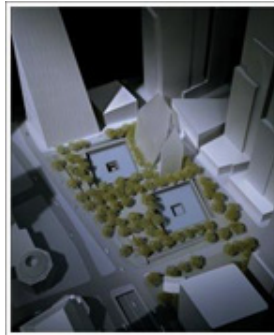
