Students Explore Nation's First Park for Spring Field Course

Under the direction of Professors Jeff Ashley and Anne Bockarie from the School of Science and Health, ten science majors ventured west to Yellowstone National Park in spring '04 as part of a field course examining the ecology and chemistry of our nation's first national park. The eight day field course included two days of tracking Yellowstone's wolf packs, white-water rafting down the Yellowstone River, touring the geothermal features of the Park, many informative hikes to examine flora and fauna, and a memorable horseback ride through a mid-May snowfall. Drs. Bockarie and Ashley plan to offer another field course during spring recess next semester centering on the ecology and culture of Jamaica.
