Board of Trustees Approves Campus Plan

Dr. Gallagher Outlined Plans at Open Forum for Faculty, Staff and Students

On Friday, November 14, President Gallagher outlined the details of Phase I of Philadelphia University's Campus Plan at an Open Forum for faculty, staff and students. The Board of Trustees officially approved the plan on November 13, initiating \$40 million in campus construction, renovation and beautification projects. By 2007, the Philadelphia University campus plans to include a new Campus Center, Recreation and Fitness Center and parking garage.
