The American Society of Mechanical Engineers awarded a \$5000 grant from the Environmental Engineering Division to support the development of curriculum that exposes undergraduate students to the field of Environmental Engineering. The grant will be used to develop a laboratory experience for SUST 102 (Water Resources and the Environment) students that will culminate in the design and construction of bench-top constructed wetlands for the purpose of remediating wastewater. A series of scaffolding lab experiments will expose students to necessary hydrological, chemical, and engineering principles to equip them with the knowledge to design their own remediation technology.
