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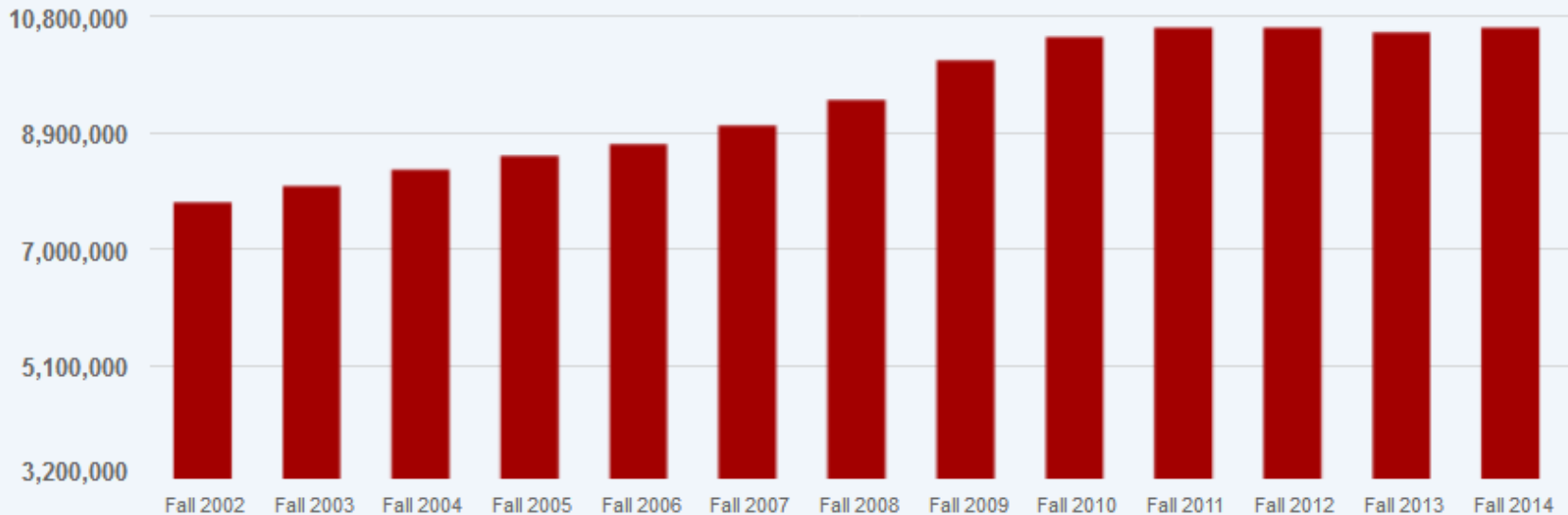

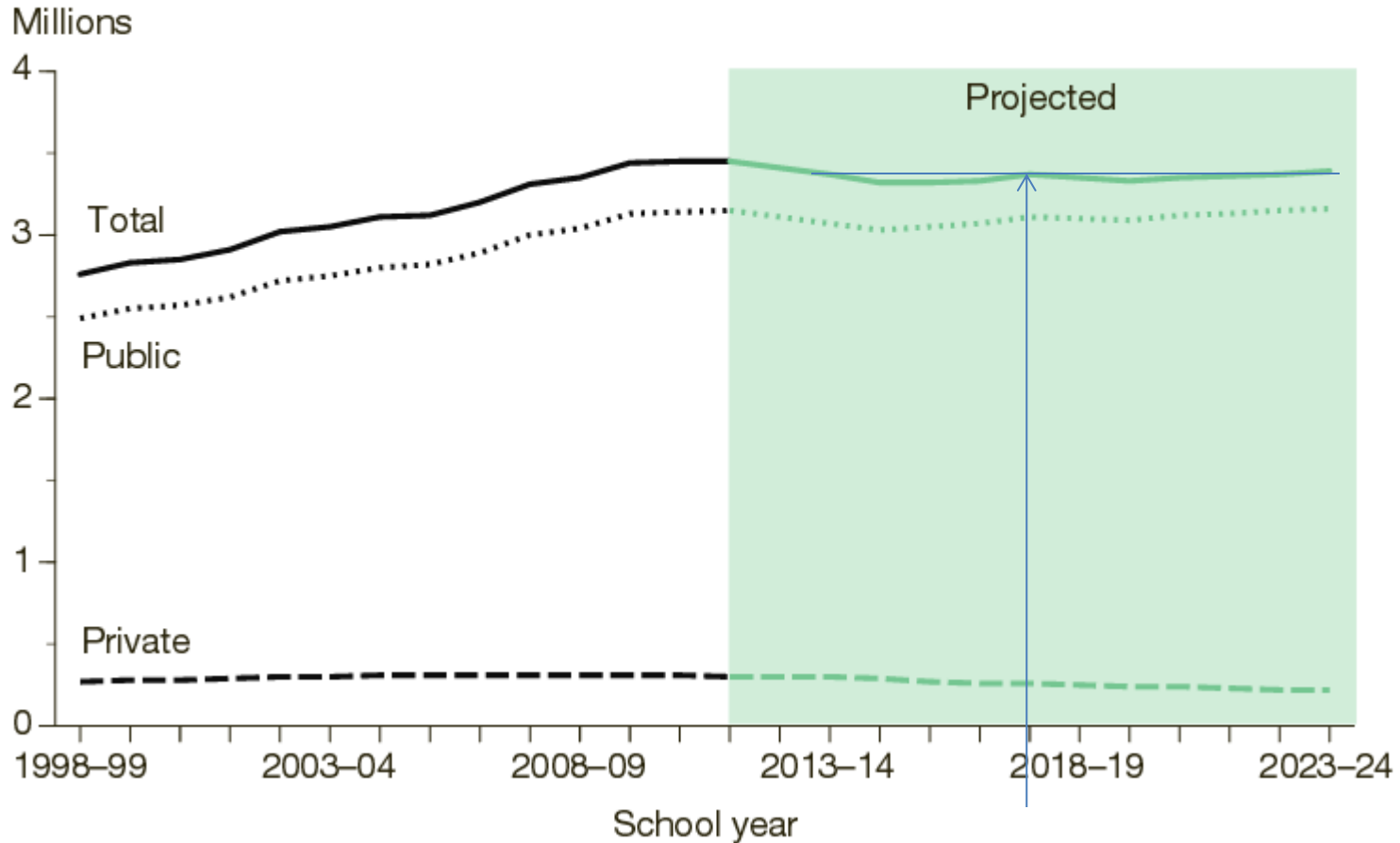

**Figure 9. Actual and projected numbers for high school graduates, by control of school: School years 1998–99 through 2023–24**



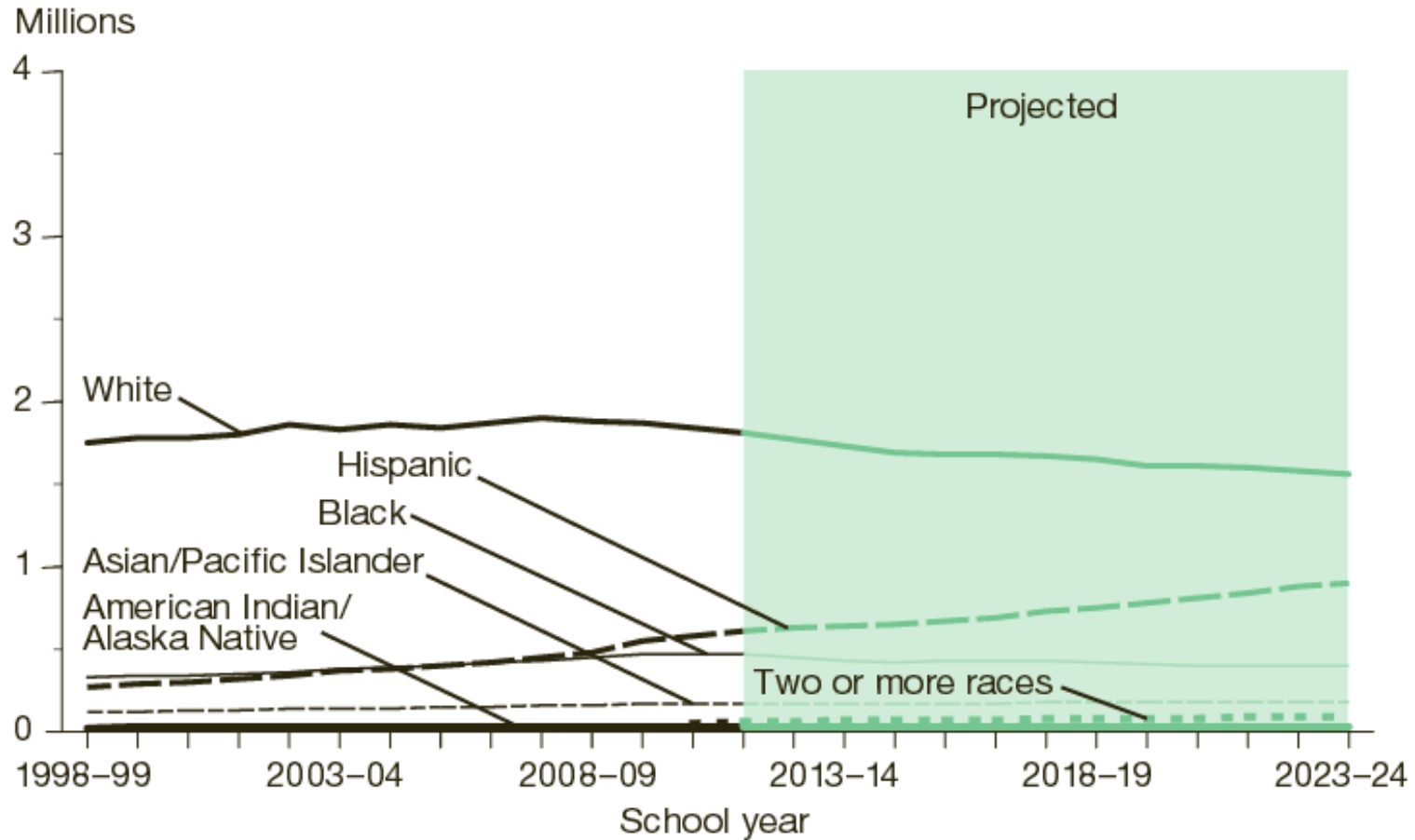

Figure 12. Actual and projected numbers for public high school graduates, by race/ethnicity: School years 1998–99 through 2023–24

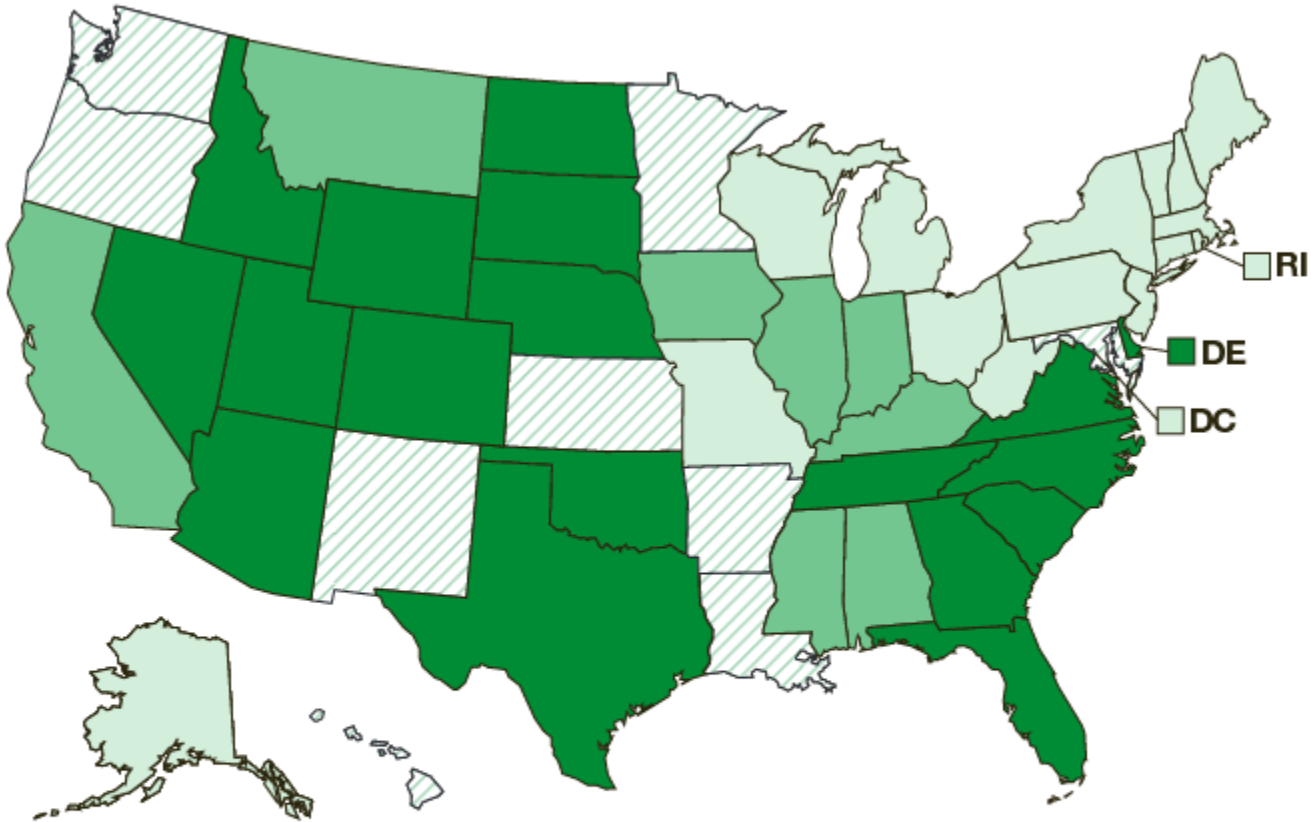

## Projected PUBLIC High School Graduates – Through 2023-24



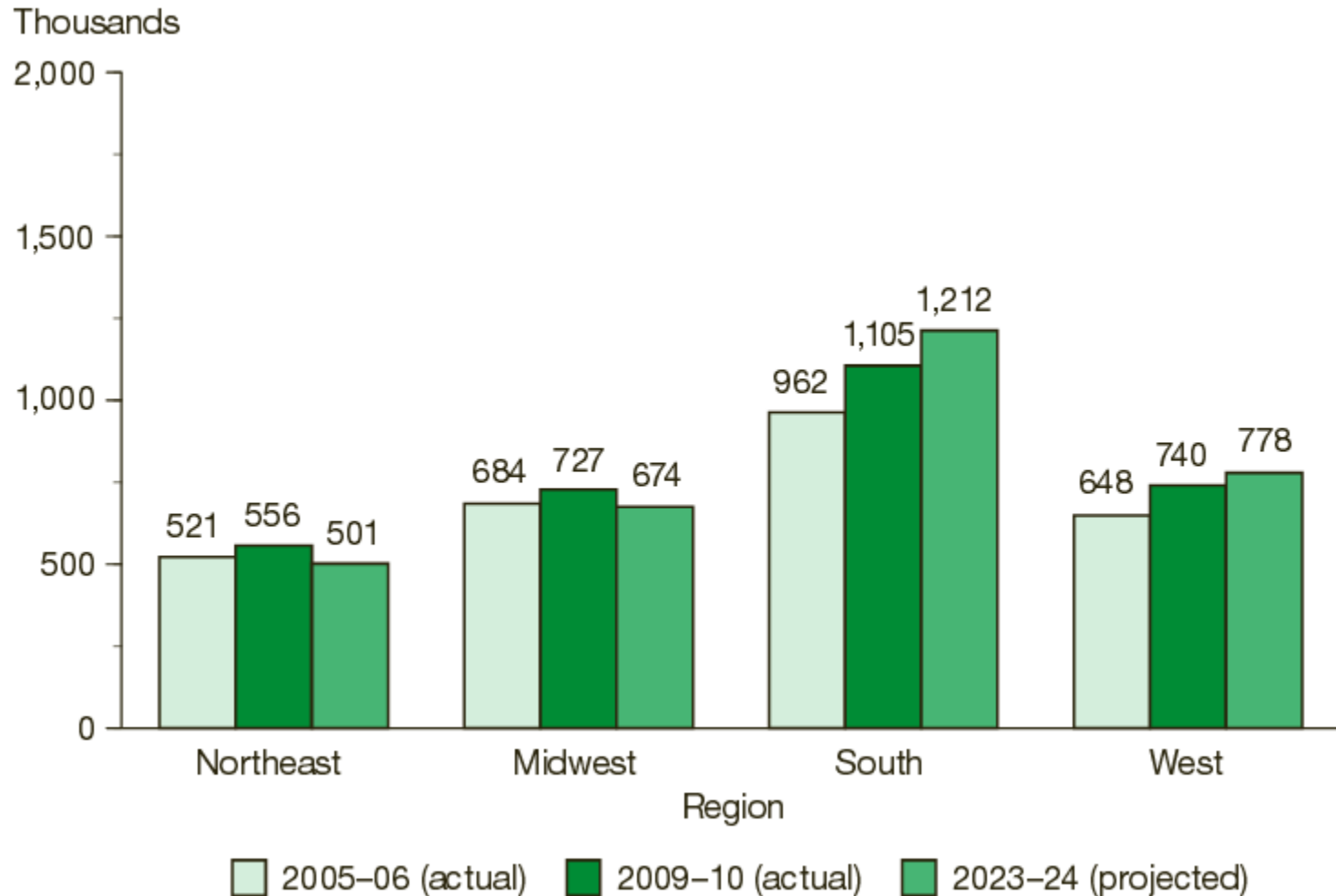
- 5 percent or more lower in 2023–24 than in 2009–10

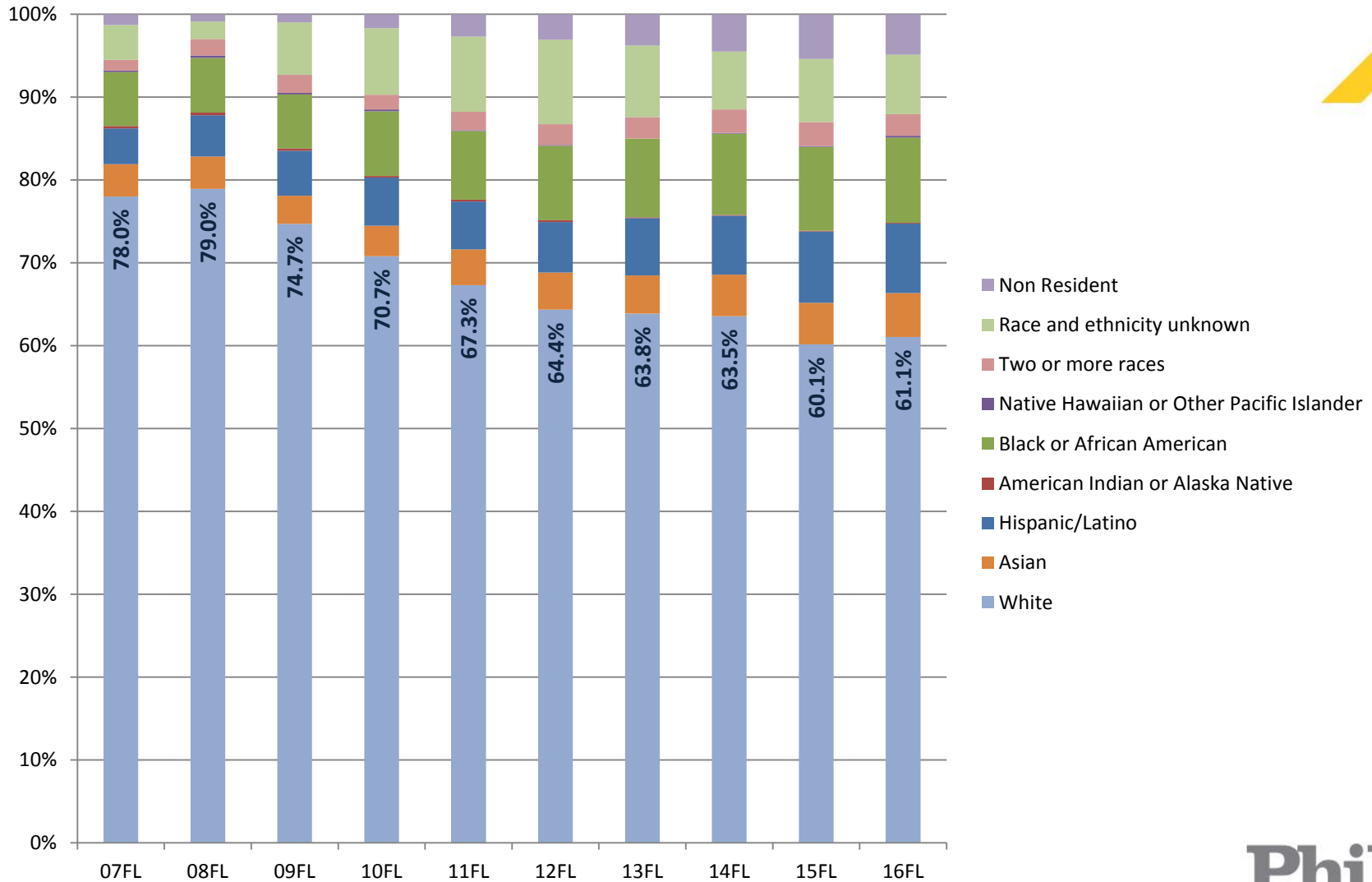
## Projected PUBLIC High School Graduates – Through 2023-24



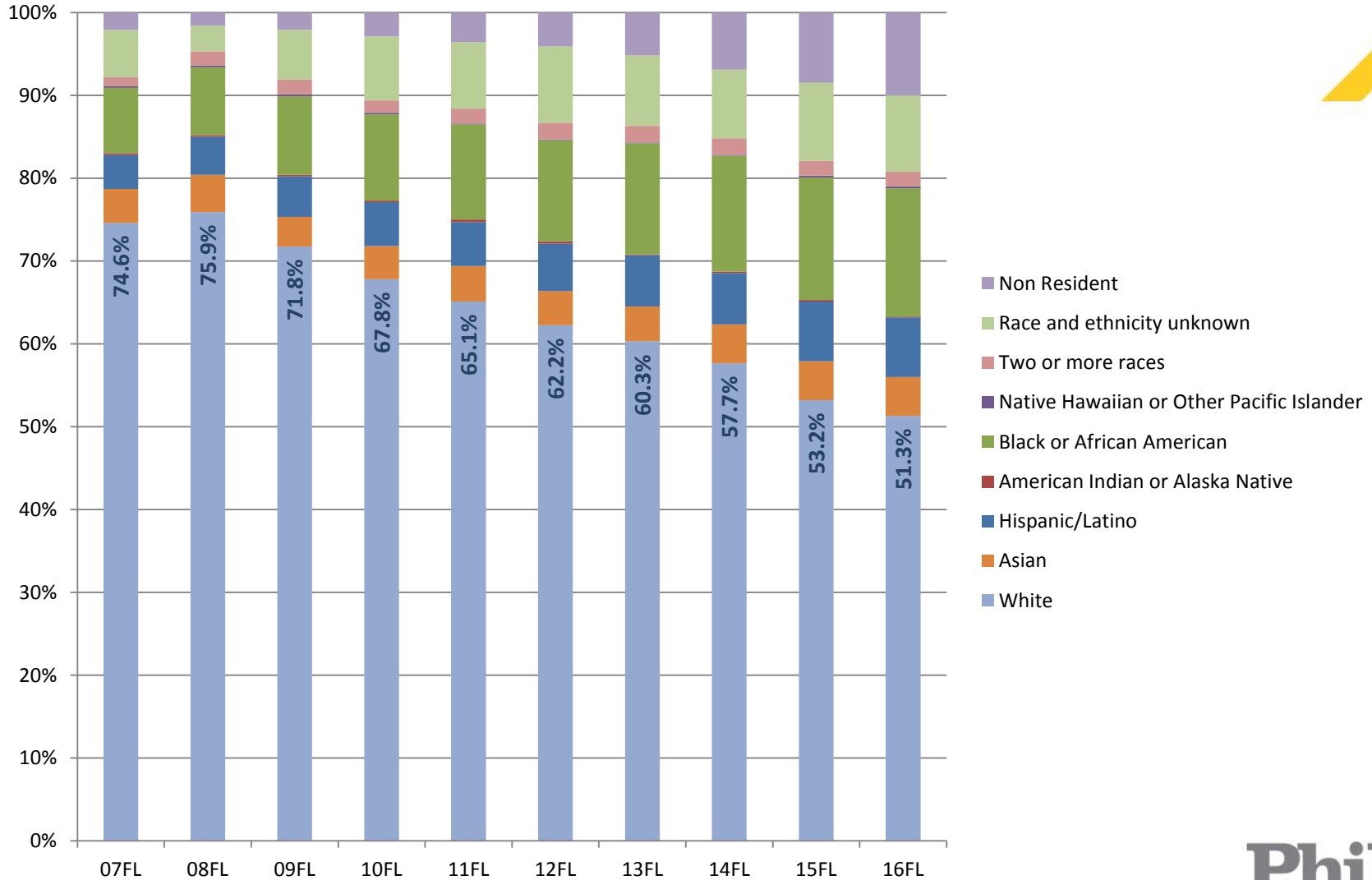

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## PhilaU Day Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity



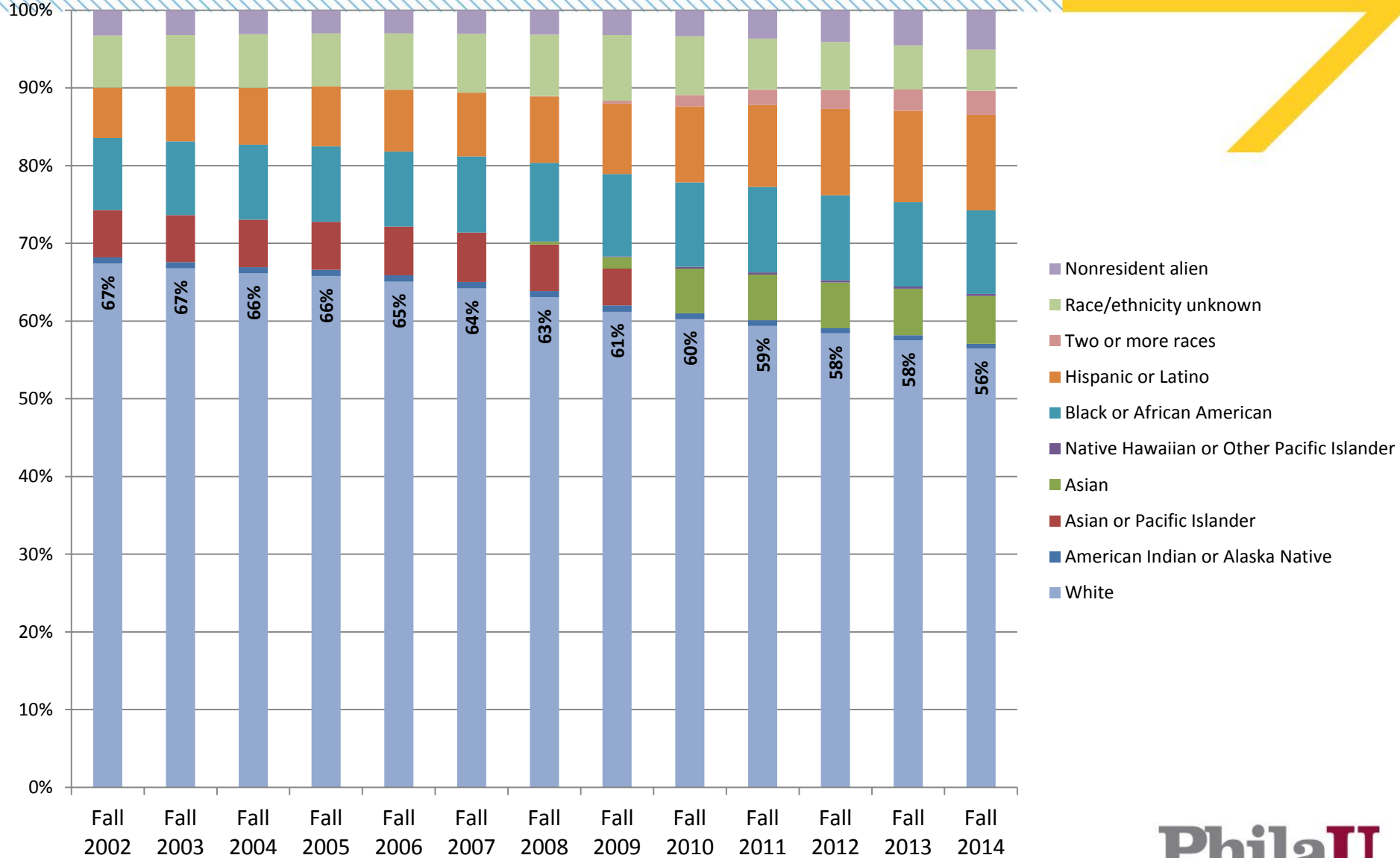
## PhilaU Total Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

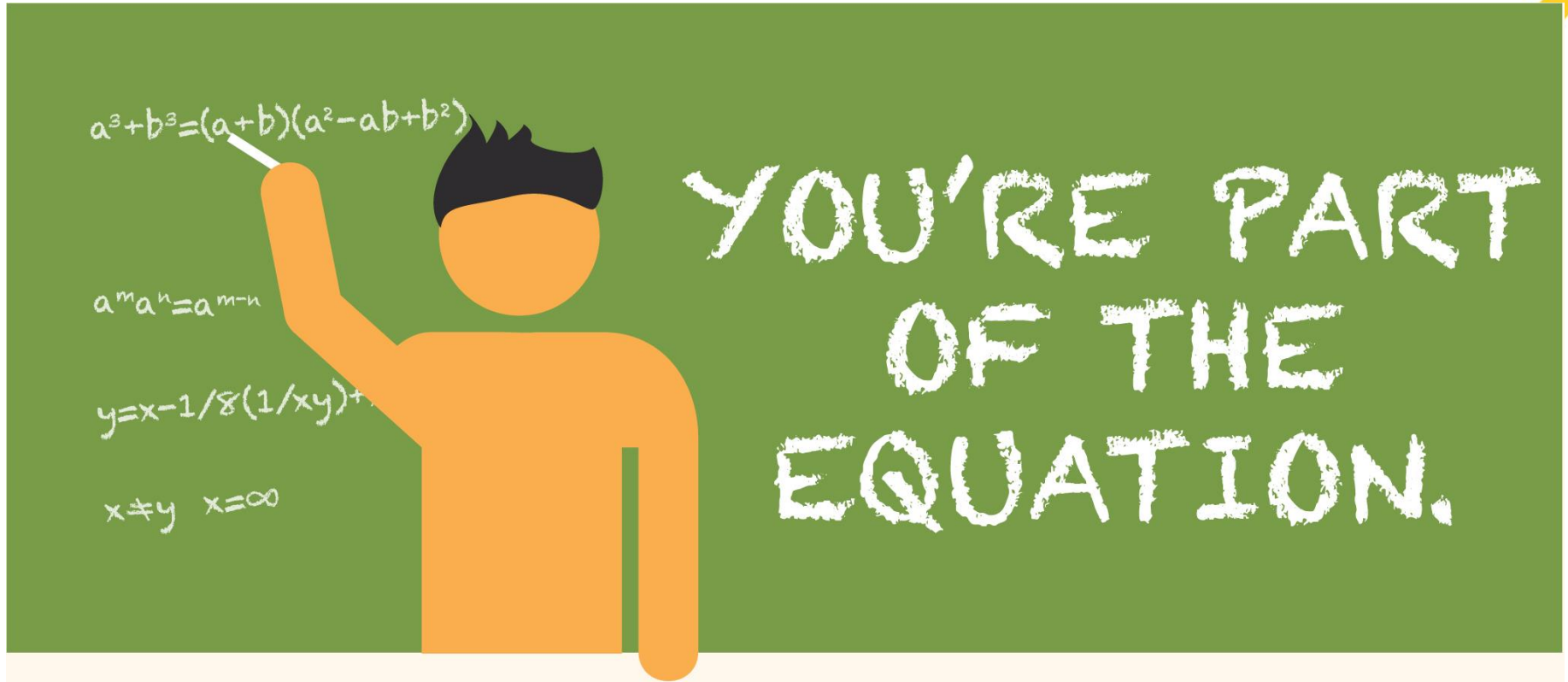
